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


#### Timeline of censuses in the 2020 round

## Lessons for the 2030 round (1)



- Transition towards multi-source statistical systems is under way
  - Increased use of administrative data -- transition towards registerbased and combined censuses
  - Increasing complexity in census designs -- integration of multiple sources and multiple response modes
  - Partnerships with holders of administrative data sources


### Censuses of the 2020 round in the UNECE region

#### UNECE

- 52 (out of 56) UNECE countries have conducted a census in the 2020 round (2015-2024)
- 14 censuses fully register-based
- 19 combined: enumeration and administrative sources
- 19 censuses collected data through enumeration only
