TASK 17.19. By 2030, building on existing initiatives, develop other indicators to complement gross domestic product to measure progress towards achieving sustainable development, and build statistical capacity.

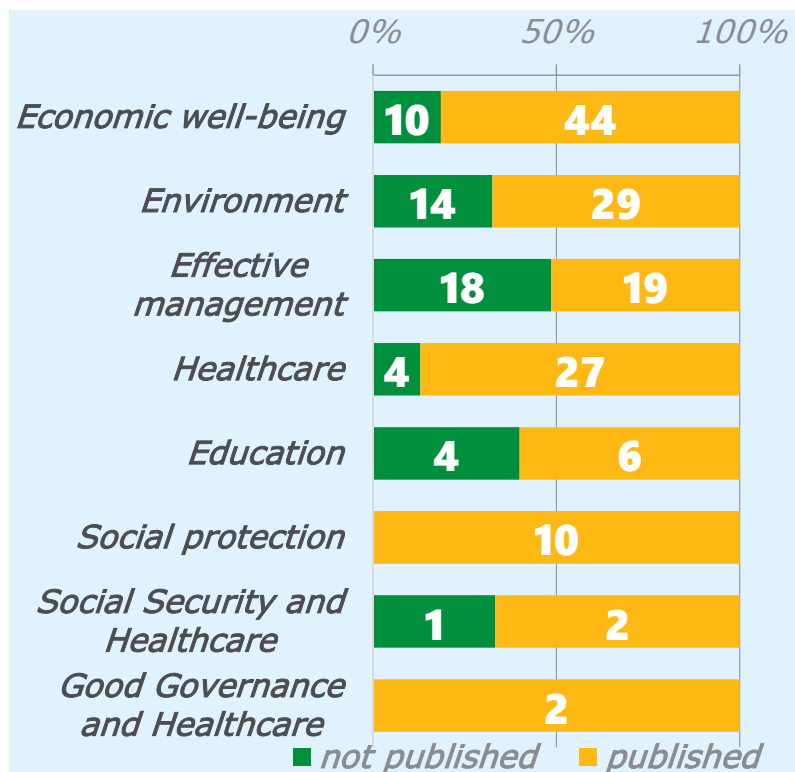

MINISTRIES AND AGENCIES RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FORMATION OF SDG INDICATORS



Currently, information is available on **143** National SDG indicators, which constitutes **75.3%** of the total number of all adopted indicators.

More than **63%** of the information on SDG indicators is generated by the National Statistics Committee. At the same time, administrative data from ministries and departments are used to calculate a number of indicators.

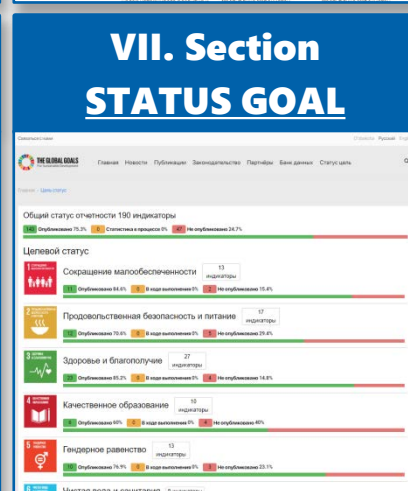
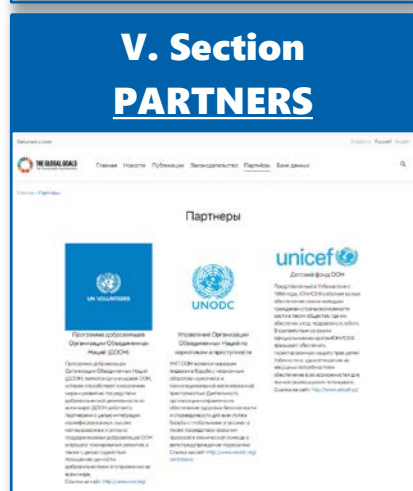
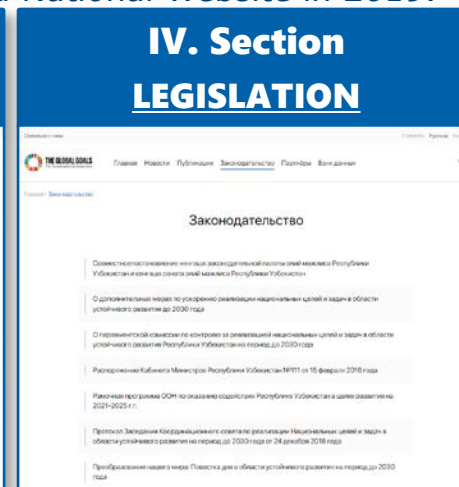
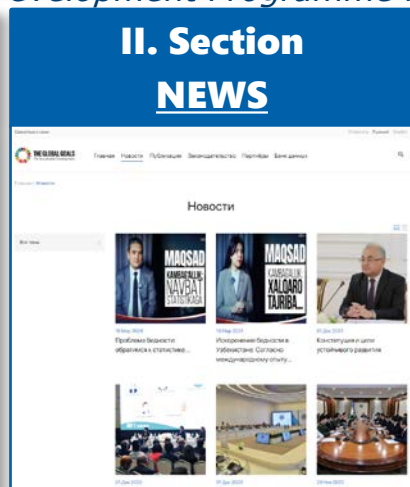


NATIONAL SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS WEBSITE

To monitor the achievements of the Sustainable Development Goals and disseminate up-to-date information on the current situation in the country, the National Statistics Committee, with the technical support of the United Nations Development Programme in Uzbekistan, developed a National Website in 2019.

- ✓ Monitor the implementation of the SDG Goals and targets adopted by the Government;
- ✓ To inform the public and make political decisions.

BEST PRACTICES IN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



The National Statistics Committee takes part in the annual survey on best practices in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, which is conducted by the **Interdepartmental and Expert Group on SDG Indicators** jointly with the **Statistics Division of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs**.

The survey covers the following areas:

- ✓ SDG data disaggregation;
- ✓ national platforms, dashboards, SDG portals and other progress assessment tools;
- ✓ Data transfer to the SDGs;
- ✓ filling data gaps on SDG indicators. Based on the survey results, Uzbekistan's best practices are published on the website of the Statistics Department "Best Practices in Achieving SDGs" (Countries: SDG Platforms, dashboards, portals, and other progress assessment tools - SDG Good Practices - UN Statistics Wiki).

REGIONAL KNOWLEDGE SHARING PLATFORM ON SDGs

The National Statistics Committee took part in a regional project to create a regional **platform for knowledge sharing on SDGs in Central Asia**, implemented by UNDP, within the framework of which a subregional information dashboard on SDG indicators was developed. The interrelationships of SDGs show how actions aimed at achieving one SDG can affect others. Uncovering and understanding these interactions can help achieve the Sustainable Development Agenda.

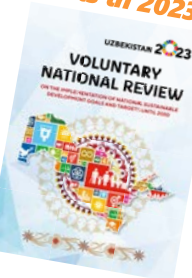


VOLUNTARY NATIONAL SURVEY

In accordance with the 2030 Agenda, all countries have committed to systematically and voluntarily reviewing the Agenda on the basis of official data at the UN ECOSOC High-Level Political Forum within 15 years. In 2020, Uzbekistan presented its **first** Voluntary National Review (VNR) at the High-Level Political Forum, and in July 2023, it presented its **second** Voluntary National Review

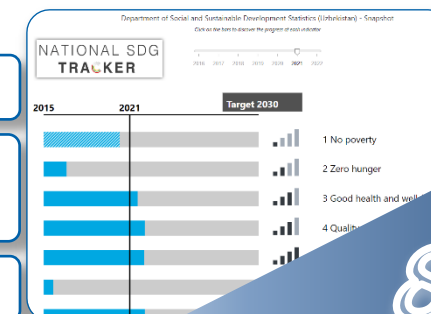

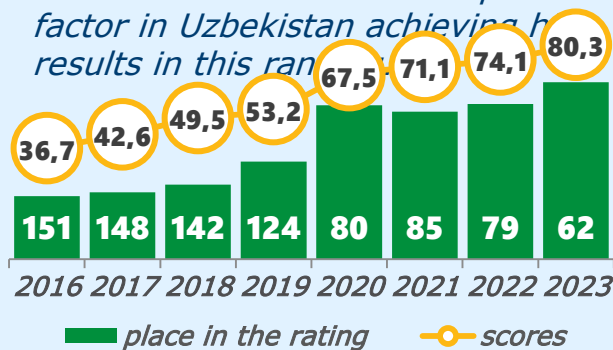
INTERNATIONAL RATINGS, INDEXES, AND SURVEYS



STATISTICAL PERFORMANCE INDICATORS (SPI)

In the World Bank's *Statistical Performance Indicators (SPI)*, in 2023, Uzbekistan rose to **62nd place** among **217 countries**, scoring **80.3 points**. Uzbekistan took the **4th place** among the CIS countries.

For reference : implementation of modern management methods in the national statistical system, the formation of SDG indicators and their regular publication, ensuring transparency and openness of data, as well as the full implementation of the system of national accounts are an important factor in Uzbekistan achieving these results in this ranking.

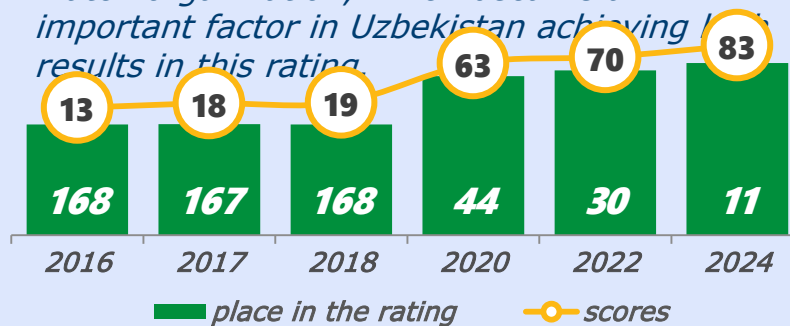

According to the results of 2024, Uzbekistan rose to 11th place among 198 countries with an 83-point score in the *Open Data Inventory (ODIN)* international open data ranking, retaining **1st place** in *Central Asia*.

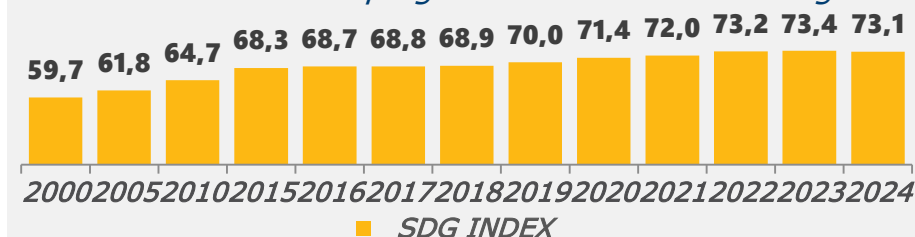
For reference: The launch and capabilities of the Integrated Statistics Information System (SIAT) portal, developed by the National Committee on Statistics, were positively assessed by experts from the Open Data Watch organization, which became an important factor in Uzbekistan achieving these results in this rating.

According to the *SDG INDEX* report published in 2025 by the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) and international experts, Uzbekistan ranked **62nd** among **167 countries** with an index of **73.1** and was ranked among the **five** fastest developing countries in this ranking.

OBJECTIVES AND PLANNED ACTIVITIES



MAIN TASKS AT THE CURRENT MOMENT

- ✓ Preparation and implementation of the **POPULATION CENSUS** to obtain up-to-date demographic and socio-economic information.
- ✓ Organization of an **AGRICULTURAL CENSUS** with the aim of collecting data on the structure and resources of the agricultural sector.
- ✓ Increasing the **COVERAGE of STATISTICAL INDICATORS** through the implementation of digital technologies and expansion of integration processes.
- ✓ Improving the efficiency of statistical data using technologies. **ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE**
- ✓ Increasing **HUMAN RESOURCES** and strengthening public relations.
- ✓ Improving the **NATIONAL STATISTICAL SYSTEM** in accordance with international practice.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

- ✓ A gradual transition to the **SDMX** format for high-quality calculation, collection and provision of SDG indicators to international partner organizations.
- ✓ Using geospatial information and Earth observations (EOs) to disaggregate SDGs.
- ✓ Conducting the Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (**MICS-7**).
- ✓ Conducting surveys such as the Demographic and Health Surveys (DHS) on Domestic Violence, victimization surveys, and others.
- ✓ Development of a calculation methodology for SDG indicators that are currently not available in the country and their calculation.
